Research project - Walking through the seasons



Do you enjoy a weekly walk? We are looking for people to take part in some research being carried out in rural areas in the North West and in East Anglia.

Campylobacter is a microorganism that causes diarrhoea. Whilst it is known to be found in some foods such as uncooked chicken, we are doing research looking at other places that Campylobacter may be found. This particular section of the research aims to use volunteer walkers to collect data on the presence of Campylobacter in rural areas popular with visitors.

We are asking small groups of volunteers from each region to walk a designated 3-4km route in East Anglia or in the North West up to 40 times, spread over a 16 month period (April 2013 to July 2014). We expect this to take about one hour on each occasion, normally on a Monday around midday. Volunteers will be asked to walk wearing a "bootsock" over the outside of one shoe or boot, which, when removed at the end of the walk, will be parceled up and posted off to a laboratory for testing. Volunteers will be compensated for taking part.
